Sailing to more than 16 countries, Kim Chye and Jenny's mission on board the world oldest passenger ship and largest floating book shop, *Doulos*, was one filled with God's protection and many learning experiences.

They take delight in sharing the miracles and wonders they've experienced in the two years they sailed with Doulos.

Kim Chye: The miracle that I encounter was when we were sailing from Sri Lanka to united Arup. Our side of the ship was hit by something and there's a hole, only when upon when they were washing the ship then they saw the hole. The miracle was there's no water enter the ship after nine nights of sailing.

Jenny: We experienced one miracle is when Doulos was in Pusan, in the country of Korea, we experience strong wind very strong at that time there was typhoon so we were asked by the port of authority to move out of the port because the port was new and they don't want to have any casualty and at that time there was very strong wave and wind and our captain told the whole ship company to pray again and one hour later the wind stopped so we were very glad that we didn't have to move out of the port that because if we were to move out, imagine anchoring in the middle of the sea is even worse. So we say God's protection as well and then in the afternoon many people able to come aboard the ship.

Kim Chye: One interesting miracle was in Japan, where there's a lady who come on board the ship when she's not a Christian, attending our open house activities and one of the Douloittes, Yasinta, is an Indonesian, shared her testimony on how God healed her when she's having the fourth stage of cancer and she was completely healed. Yasinta pray for her and God at work, when she go back, when she go for the test and examination, they show no cancer in her anymore for this Japanese lady and from there she accepted the Lord as her personal Lord.

In Madagascar, two Singaporean was sent out for faith walk and they go in four so two of were Singaporeans name Tony and Amy and they just go on a faith walk and they were not allowed to carry money like Jesus sent His 12 Disciples out. So it happened when someone invited them in to pray for the

daughter, the daughter could not sleep, every night scream. But when they go they were fearful but they just lay their hands and say “Lord this is what You’ve called us to do and we’ll just pray” and that girl was healed. And the parent visit the ship everyday and see them and visit them to say thank you and at that moment the parents accepted Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior.
